What is the Career Exploration Program?

The career exploration program, coordinated by the Licking County Educational Service Center, gives middle school students a chance to explore a career by visiting and interacting with professionals in their place of employment. Students interact with their peers from across the county, while learning about a career field of their choice.

Who is eligible to apply?

The career exploration program is available to seventh and eighth grade students who:

- are identified as gifted and talented/or recommended by a teacher.
- demonstrate responsibility by exhibiting excellent citizenship and by maintaining good school attendance.
- have parent approval and transportation.

Application Process

Seventh and eighth grade students who wish to apply will get an application and emergency medical form from their school counselor. On the application, students indicate three possible areas of career interest. Students selected for the program will have the opportunity to explore one of those careers through a one day experience with professionals in that field.

Please Note: Because this is a county wide program, students may not get their first choice.

When do career exploration visitations occur ?

Trips occur during school hours. Program attendance counts as a regular school day.

STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITIES IN THE CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM

- Complete an application which includes three possible career choices for career exploration and turn it in by the designated deadline.
- Reflect on how school achievement can impact career opportunities.
- Make arrangements with parents for transportation to the career exploration site.
- Attend one full-day group career exploration experience at a business establishment.
- Interact with career professionals and peers from around the county.
- Behave in an exemplary manner during the career exploration visit.
- Complete an evaluation related to your experience.
- Call the Educational Service Center if an emergency arises and you CANNOT attend on your scheduled day (740-349-6084).

Information for Parents

- Parents are responsible for arranging all transportation to and from the career exploration trip.
- The school assumes no responsibility for transportation.

What do participants have to say?

Owens-Coring was a very interesting shadowing opportunity. The fact that a very fragile thing like glass could be made into a strong ballistic armor for tanks is mindblowing.
